Please make sure your child's belongings are labelled with their full name and that their book bag is in school every day.

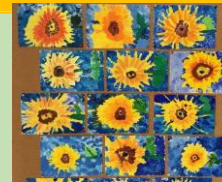
We deliver a balanced curriculum of indoor and outdoor learning. Therefore, please ensure that your child has appropriate weather-proof clothing.
